Theme: **European trends in supervision and monitoring**

This meeting is about the developments in national supervision and monitoring in those areas that are highly influenced by European rules. Three experts in their field will inform us about new trends in such areas as product regulation, financial markets and migration of workers. Looking at these three rather different areas of EC policy we might be able to find general trends in the EC approach of supervision and monitoring activities.

In the EU the system of mutual recognition is dominant. Once a product or service is licensed to be on the market additional national regulation is generally out of bounds, although member states might feel the need to do so, e.g. when the home state has not done its home work. The collapse of the Icelandic banks and the Icesave affair are still fresh in our minds. In those cases, when national supervision and control fail, the natural response of the EC is to set up an European supervision agency or an equivalent, to oversee the national supervision authorities and if need be add new regulation. In the case of Icesave the advisory commission presided by De Larosière suggested this as one of their proposals to reorganize supervision on banks. But does this always solve the real problems?
