**Introduction** Civil procedural law in the Netherlands and Belgium is changing rapidly. An important reason for this is the progressive digitalisation. This allows that no longer has to be communicated in writing (or by fax) with the judicial organisation. In addition, more attention is paid to the quality of the case law. In the Netherlands this has led to the project Quality and Innovation (Kwaliteit en Innovatie, KEI) and in Belgium to the potpourri legislation. Furthermore, judges have been set up to resolve the underlying conflict. This strengthens the role of the judge in the procedure and also changes the role of the judge.
