## Workshop: Property Law II

### Theme: Property and Resilience

Workshop II will be devoted to the concept of resilience in property law. The approach is very different than a usual Ius Commune Property Law workshop. We have selected three academic contributions on resilience in property law. These contributions will be introduced by a 'young' property scholar who will also open the discussion. The discussion will be moderated by Dr. Jill Robbie and Prof.Dr. Bram Akkermans.

We aim for an inclusive discussion where we – together – explore the meaning of resilience in property law.
